Leader	<p>Jerome M. Zaslow, Chairman of the Board & Chief Strategist ATD-American Co.</p> <p>Jerome M. Zaslow (Jerry) is a native Philadelphian who graduated from South Philadelphia High School for Boys in 1943. He studied the Commercial Course since he never expected to attend college, but a 23-year-old salesman employed in his father's South Street linen and curtain store advised Jerry to attend college "even if you never use it". Jerry sought the advice of his mother who dropped out of high school at age 14. She said, "Ok, if you want to go", and suggested the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania because her father, an immigrant tailor, had a customer who was a professor at Wharton and "he was such a nice man".</p> <p>Jerry completed his degree during wartime acceleration, graduating in 1945 at the age of 20, and joined the family retail business, founded in 1931 by his father. In 1952, Jerry changed the business model to American Textile Distributors, a wholesale textile bid business that catered to agencies of cities, counties, states and the federal government, worldwide. Business and institutional office furniture was added to the product line in the 1960s, and the company name was changed to ATD-American Co. (ATD). Law enforcement products were added in later years and in September 2001, the day after 9/11; ATD acquired 104 year old Thomaston Mills, the last textile company remaining in the US, manufacturing bedsheets and pillow cases. In February of 2008, ATD also acquired Adirondack Direct, a \$20,000,000 direct mail furniture catalog company that focused on the church, school and business markets.</p> <p>Currently, ATD, with their staff of 250 valued employees, is approaching the \$100,000,000 mark and its mission is to profitably grow organically and through acquisition. Janet Wischnia, a Drexel MBA and Jerry's oldest daughter, is President and CEO of ATD while Jerry is Chairman of the Board and Chief Strategist. Next generation ...look out for Jake, Janet's son...he is dynamite.</p>
